

Make your Point



Goals:

Let's get ready to rumble. Being able to defend a point of view with well thought out arguments and evidence is an important skill. Help students master this skill by collecting evidence from their reading and using it to formulate and support their viewpoint. This activity develops critical thinking, presentation and teamwork skills.



Description:

Students are divided into teams and work together to find evidence within the text that supports an assigned viewpoint. Once the evidence is collected, students create a presentation to convince others in the class that their viewpoint is correct. After all the presentations are complete students vote on which viewpoint was most convincing.

How to Glose:

- Ohoose a book with multiple viewpoints. Create a thesis for each of these groups.
- ☑ Break the class into teams and assign a thesis for each group.
- Students read together and use Glose for Education app yellow highlights to collect arguments for their point of view and then add comments to explain how this evidence supports their perspective.
- Students organize their evidence into a presentation and deliver to the class
- Olass votes to determine the group that most effectively proved their viewpoint.

Extend	Support	Connect
Have students develop their own thesis statement on the same reading material and support with evidence.	Assign roles to members of the team so that everyone is participating in collecting evidence.	Have students write an essay explaining their viewpoint using the evidence they collected as a group.
